

Choose one sound from each carriage on the train to make a word. How many words you can make? Can you make more words than your mum or dad? Challenge them!



#### PARENT TIP!


Allow your child some time to write stories, lists or invitations when they're simply writing without thinking about their handwriting. It's also vital for them to dedicate some time to letter formation, though.





#### PARENT TIP!




### PARENT TIP!






This is a great activity to help children think about characterisation in stories. They could do other posters for other characters from favourite stories, or even a WANTED poster for a 'baddie' in a story!
