<u>Curriculum Learning Overview</u> Autumn Term 2023: Class 2

This document will hopefully give you an overview of what Class 2's learning will look like during the Autumn term.

Curriculum coverage:

- Phonics, Maths and English are taught daily.
- PE will be on a Thursday & Friday. Please ensure children come in their PE kits.
- Music, PSHE and metacognition are taught weekly.

All other subjects are 'blocked' (taught daily over a period of 1 or 2 weeks). Please see page 2 for an outline of what will be covered in topics this term.

English: Reading & Writing

Our reading and writing this term will explore the following themes. During Autumn 1, the focus will be on traditional tales. The focus texts will be Jack and The Beanstalk and The Three Little Pigs.

During Autumn 2, we will explore well-loved stories. The Tiger who came to tea and Owl Babies. We will also look at poems and some non-fiction writing; our writing and reading will be based around these books and texts.

The children will continue to use our VIPERS acronym to enhance their comprehension skills and explain key events in the text and the main characters feelings. (Vocabulary, Inference, Predict. Explain, Retrieve, Summarise).

Maths

The principal focus of mathematics teaching in Key Stage 1 is to ensure that pupils develop confidence and mental fluency with whole numbers, counting and place value. We will be developing fluency through our daily fluency practice.

Year 1 – Place Value (within 10), followed by addition and subtraction and shape. Year 2 – Place Value (within 100), followed by addition and subtraction and shape.

Music

This term the focus for music will be on pulse and rhythm. We will be practicing using our voices in different ways, feeling the pulse and listening to a piece of music with concentration. PE

A sporting influence coach will be Miss Bruce, they will teach PE every Thursday afternoon. PE on Friday afternoon is class teacher lead.

Autumn Term

Art: Shape (Drawing)

We will be exploring the work of Paul Klee and using his famous pieces of art to inspire the children's creativity. We will do this by creating abstract compositions using various shapes and identify, make and design their use of shape for print.

Computing

In computing this term, we will be focusing on project evolve and digital literacy (computing systems and networks – information around us)

<u>RE</u>

In Autumn 1 – The children will explore the story of creation from Genesis, they will begin to recognise that 'Creation' is the beginning of the 'big story' of the bible. They retell the story of creation and will say what the story tells Christians about god.

In Autumn 2 – To use creative ways to express their own ideas about the creation story. We will talk about the issues of good, bad, right and wrong arising from the stories.

History

Recall the date the original building of Spofforth Castle was built. Understand and explain the role of a castle- including parts of a castle and the role of knights. Understand and explain what Spofforth castle was used for and talking about the links with the Percy Family.

Science: Everyday Materials

The children will focus on the use of everyday materials including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water and rock. Together we will explore which objects can be bent, twisted, stretched and manipulated and begin to realise why an object is suitable for its use e.g. why is a saucepan metal and not plastic.

·. Design and Technology: Textiles.

The children will design a pouch and evaluate these. The key skills they will be using are

- Cutting fabric for sewing,
- Decorating pouches using fabric glue or running stitch
- Evaluate the quality of the stitching on someone else's pouch
- Discuss as a class the success of their stitching against the success criteria.

PSHE: (Personal, Social, Health & Education):

In PSHE this term, we will be focusing on the topics 'Identity, society and equality'. During this topic the children will learn:

The children will learn about what makes them special, the roles and responsibilities they have at school and at home. Finishing up with learning about being cooperative with others.

Ideas for creative writing at home this term...

- Write a recount of your favourite part of the summer holiday.
- Create a list of items to pack in a suit case.
- Write a postcard to a friend/family member.

• Create a picture that shares the emotions that the character is feeling.

- Write a story with a beginning, middle and end.
- Write your own version of the three little pigs.
